Paraphrasing tips

- 1. Read the original carefully for a general idea of its meaning.
- 2. Circle the key words or phrases, ideas that you cannot leave out.
- 3. Change the grammar, vocabulary and sentence structure of the original (using a combination of the six paraphrasing tools described below)
- 4. Compare your paraphrase with the original to see if it fits the criteria of a good paraphrase.

Find synonyms for some of the words.

Original: Adolescent employees sometimes argue with their employers.

Revised: Teenage workers sometimes disagree with their supervisors.

Now Try Tool 1 (find synonyms)

Original: Paraphrasing involves taking a set of facts or opinions and rewording them.

Make an opposite verb negative.

Original: In times of crisis, politicians may ignore public opinion

Revised: In times of crisis, politicians may not acknowledge public opinion.

Now Try Tool 2 (negative opposite verb)

Original: When paraphrasing, it is important to keep the original meaning.

Try combining tools 1 & 2 (synonyms and negative opposite verb)

Original: When paraphrasing, it is important to keep the original meaning.

Change voice: Make active sentences passive and passive ones, active.

Original: The voucher was sent by the testing service on August 3rd.

Revised: The testing service sent the voucher on August 3rd.

Now Try Tool 3 (Active \rightarrow Passive)

Original: The writer presents the original idea in a new form.

Now Try Combining Tool 3 with Tools 1 and/or 2 (active\passive, synonyms, negative opposite verb)

Original: The writer presents the original idea in a new form.

Revised again: _____

Change parts of speech: Change nouns into verbs, verbs into nouns, etc.

Original: The teacher helped the student finish her class registration form.

Revised: The teacher helped the student register for classes.

Now Try Tool 4 (change parts of speech) and try combining it with the previous tools

Original: Writers can learn how to manipulate language for their own benefit.

Combine sentences: Combine shorter phrases and sentences using connecting words or clauses.

Original: The movie was shot in New York City. Many actors choose to live in New York.

Revised: The movie was shot in New York City, where many actors choose to live.

Now Try Tool 5 (combine sentences) and try to combine it with other tools

Original: Paraphrasing is a skill students need to learn. It is an important part of writing.

Move phrases: Move parts of a sentence to change the sentence structure.

Original: To fight a damaging disease, the farmers began to grow genetically modified crops.

Revised: The farmers began to grow genetically modified crops to fight a damaging disease.

Now Try Tool 6 (move phrases) and try combining it with other tools

Original: Many students aren't able to paraphrase well without using a dictionary.

Practice various tools to rewrite the sentences

- 1. The president spoke to the angry crowd, hoping to pacify them.
- 2. An architect has to be able to envision the buildings she or he designs.
- 3. He always tries to dominate the conversation, so it's difficult for anyone else to talk.
- 4. In spite of the strong wind that blew in the window, everything on my desk is still intact.
- 5. It is not easy to find a homogeneous group of students because all students have different backgrounds and different ideas.
