## PRACTICAL TASKS

# 1. Identifying Discourse Markers

### Task:

Read a short paragraph and identify all discourse markers (e.g., however, therefore, in fact, meanwhile, on the other hand).

I wanted to join the meeting; however, my schedule was full. In fact, I had three deadlines that day. Therefore, I asked my colleague to attend instead.

# 2. Analysing Speech Acts

## Task:

Identify the speech act (request, apology, refusal, compliment, warning, promise). Explain how language softens or strengthens the act.

"Could you please send me the report by noon?"
"I'm really sorry, but I may need an extra hour."

## 3. Cohesion Chains

#### Task:

Find cohesion devices:

- → reference (he, it, this issue)
- → lexical chains (synonyms, repetitions)
- → ellipsis
- → substitution
- → conjunctions
  Explain how they contribute to text unity.

Maria bought a new laptop yesterday. The device is much faster than her old one. This improvement will help her finish projects more efficiently.

# 4. Power and Hierarchy in Discourse

## Task:

Compare two interactions:

Text (Doctor-Patient):

"You need to start the medication today. Please follow the dosage exactly."

Text (Employer–Employee):

"Could you send me the completed file by 5 p.m.? Let me know if you need resources."

Identify linguistic markers of power (imperatives, modal verbs, hesitations, turn-taking). Explain how hierarchy shapes discourse.

# 5. Genre Analysis

#### Task:

Compare two genres (e.g., a news article vs. an Instagram post). Identify differences in:

- purpose
- audience
- structure
- tone
- vocabulary
- visual elements (if any)

## **Text (News Article):**

"According to the Ministry's latest report, unemployment decreased by 3% this quarter."

## **Text (Instagram Post):**

"Feeling grateful today Vew opportunities are on the horizon!"

# 6. Critical Discourse Analysis (Fairclough-based mini task)

#### Task:

Choose a short political or media statement.

Identify:

- word choices used to construct authority or fear
- framing strategies
- "us vs. them" distinctions
  Explain how language shapes ideology.

#### Text:

"Our community must protect itself from harmful outside influences. Only strong leadership can ensure safety for all."
