solar panels: devices that convert sunlight into electricity

to source (something): to obtain materials or products from a specific supplier or location

The restaurant **sources** its ingredients from local farmers.



toiletries: personal care items like soap, shampoo, and toothpaste

Single-use **toiletries** are being replaced with refillable options in many hotels.



rainwater harvesting: the collection and storage of rainwater for reuse

The farm uses **rainwater harvesting** to irrigate crops.



glamping: luxury camping that combines outdoor experiences with modern comforts
