

Sentence construction

Passive voice can be used in almost every tense in the English language. However, it is worth understanding that the construction of the sentences will be different.

Tense	Structure
Present Simple	AM / IS / ARE + V3
Past Simple	WAS / WERE + V3
Future Simple	WILL BE + V3
Present Continuous	AM / IS / ARE + BEING + V3
Past Continuous	WAS / WERE + BEING + V3
Future Continuous	–
Present Perfect	HAVE / HAS + BEEN + V3
Past Perfect	HAD + BEEN + V3
Future Perfect	WILL + HAVE + BEEN + V3
Present Perfect Continuous	–
Past Perfect Continuous	–
Future Perfect Continuous	–

Passive voice forms

Tense	Active Voice	Passive Voice
Present Simple	Tina makes the cake.	The cake is made by Tina.
Past Simple	Tina made the cake yesterday.	The cake was made by Tina yesterday.
Future Simple	Tina will make the cake tomorrow.	The cake will be made by Tina tomorrow.
Present Continuous	Tina is making the cake right now.	The cake is being made by Tina right now.
Past Continuous	Tina was making the cake when I called her.	The cake was being made by Tina when I called her.
Future Continuous	Tina will be making the cake tomorrow at 5 a.m.	–
Present Perfect	Tina has already made the cake.	The cake has already been made by Tina.
Past Perfect	Tina had already made the cake before the TV show started.	The cake had already been made by Tina before the TV show started.

Future Perfect	Tina will have made the cake till tomorrow evening.	The cake will have been made by Tina till tomorrow evening.
Present Perfect Continuous	Tina has been making the cake all the morning.	—
Past Perfect Continuous	Tina had been making the cake all the morning before I came home.	—
Future Perfect Continuous	Tina will have been making the cake tomorrow from 5 a.m. till 7 a.m.	—
