Passive Voice II

We form the **Progressive tenses** in the Passive Voice with the appropriate form of the verb **be + being + the past participle of the main verb.**

| • When a verb (<i>give, offer, send, etc.</i>) takes two objects in the Active Voice, there are two ways of forming the Passive Voice. | Active Voice: They gave William a present. Passive Voice: William was given a present. OR: A present was given to William. | |
